ENCOURAGING WORDS

"The human mind is an amazing thing in that, whatever it's looking for, it tends to find. So, if you're looking for ugliness, you'll have no trouble finding it. What are you looking for in the children who are part of your kids ministry? So often we expect different things from different kids based on your past experiences of those kids. Often children behave in certain ways because they think that is what is expected of them by adults.

Why not look for those fleeting bits of goodness (kind behaviour, manners, sharing, etc) and individually encourage the child by expressing to the child how you were impressed with their action, attitude or word. The more you are positive, the more responsive the child will become.

Why not try each week to note at least one positive point for each of the kids in your ministry and commit to encouraging each child before they leave?

You may be pleasantly surprised after a few weeks.

CANDY CANE

Candy Canes have been around for 100's of years. Some were straight and others plain white. It has been said that about 100 years ago, a Candy Maker in Indiana, USA, wanted to show people the real meaning of Christmas. So he invented the bent red & white Christmas Candy Cane.

If we turn the Candy Cane upside down, it is the shape of the letter 'J'. This reminds us of Jesus, the gift God gave the world at Christmas.



The middle of the candy is white. This reminds us that Jesus lived a completely pure & perfect life. Around the cane we see a red stripe. This reminds us that at the end of Jesus' life he died on the cross.


As you enjoy your Candy Cane, remember that at Christmas we celebrate Jesus' birthday, the day when God gave the greatest gift of all to this world!

PARTY POPPER TIMER - Game

Suitable for 9+ years old.

In this game, have 3 contestants come out the front and give them each a party popper. They hold the string so that they can pull it at the set time causing it to "pop".

When the leader calls "start", the contestants have to determine in their mind when 27 seconds is up. They then pull their strings and cause their party poppers to "explode". The person who pulls their string the closest to the 27 seconds is the winner.

Safety requires the leader to warn the contestants to hold the party popper away from their face or not in the direction of others.

Leader - use a stop watch or similar. Ensure no clocks are on the wall or audience doesn't use their watches to help!

Option: You can use Bon-Bons at Christmas time in place of the party poppers ... though it's not as loud!!!!
